

Summer Learning Plan 2021

The following apply to all

- **Social Distancing**: is still encouraged in all settings when practical and possible.
- **Screening Process**: same as school year expectations. Students self-screen prior to attendance but screening sheets are not collected (see screening sheet).
- The protocols outlined in this document are subject to change as needed to maintain the safety of staff and students given the changing circumstances.
- ^ denotes a change from the school year protocols.

DISTRICT AND SCHOOL OFFICES	
District and school offices	Offices will be open for regular business throughout the summer during the posted summer hours and can be accessed by students, parents, community members, staff and other guests.^
Masks will be optional in the office areas.^ Protective barriers will be utilized by office staff working directly with the public.	

SUMMER SCHOOL CLASSROOMS	
Masks	Students and Staff will have the personal option of wearing a mask starting June 1 st unless required in the situations listed in the PPE Summer 2021 guidance.^
Lunch or Breakfast	It is encouraged to maintain 3' spacing
Library books/other classroom items	Do not need to be quarantined.^
Field trips	Allowed and masks are optional.^
Bussing	Allowed and masks are optional.^
Speakers/Mentors/Presenters	Allowed and masks are optional.^
Kids Inc.	Parents are allowed inside the building to pick up students.^
The mixing of classrooms and cohorts	The mixing of classes can occur during the summer classes and in activities.^

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COVID CASES & CLOSE CONTACTS	
Positive Cases	Positive cases either reported by DOH or the parent must be excluded from school for 10 days from the onset of symptoms (and 24 hours without fever AND symptoms improved). The school will support the need for those students and staff to isolate. Excused absences and remote work would be offered to students.
Close Contacts	Tracking of Close Contacts*^: Contact tracing will no longer be done in the school setting (Change). DOH may contact staff and students due to close contact exposure outside of school. The school will support the need for those students and staff to quarantine when notified by the DOH. Excused absences and remote work would be offered to students.
Symptomatic	All students must self-screen prior to attendance (see screening sheet). If a student is symptomatic during school or an activity, the student will be isolated, and the parent will be called. Isolation procedures at school will be the same as the school year.

***Close contacts: The recent introduction of independent Covid-19 test kits that can be purchased at Walgreens, Walmart, CVS etc., and the fact that those results are not submitted to the Department of Health, makes processing positives cases, close contact clearance, and the need to contact trace, unreliable and even more difficult for schools. Schools would not be able to confirm these results and would have to make decisions based on unverified information. The schools will focus efforts on existing mitigation measures and ensuring symptomatic and positive cases are not in attendance.**
